

# **Department of Public Works**

Did you know that shoveling, snow blowing or plowing snow into the roadway is a violation of the NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law?!

Section 1219(a) of the law states: No person shall throw or deposit upon any highway any glass bottle, glass, nails, tacks, wire, cans, snow or



any other substance likely to injure any person, animal or vehicle upon such highway.

In addition to the issuance of a summons by the Colonie Police Department, if an accident is caused by your action, you may be held responsible for the injuries or damage caused.

The Village of Colonie takes great pride in maintaining your roadways. We are asking for your cooperation in this matter. Please help the DPW in keeping the Village roadways a safe place for those who use them.

### **Snow Emergencies**

A snow emergency in the Village goes into effect after 6 inches or more of snow accumulates or there is enough snow, sleet or ice accumulation that it creates or is likely to create dangerous conditions for driving and walking. Vehicles cannot be parked on the street during a snow emergency. By keeping vehicles off the street this allows plowing, salting and snow removal to happen in a safe and timely manner. Notice of a snow emergency will be posted to local media, our posting boxes, and on our website colonievillage.org. Snow emergencies remain in effect for 48 hours or unless it is deemed safe to suspend one earlier. If a snow emergency is declared during the hours of 11pm to 7am, the snow emergency will not be enforced until 7am. If your vehicle remains parked on the road during a snow



emergency, it will be towed and the fines with the towing company will the responsibility of the vehicle's owner. Chris Bisognano, Asst. Superintendent of Public Works

### **EXEMPTION INFORMATION:**

If you are a Senior Citizen, a Veteran, or a Person with a Disability, the Village of Colonie provides property tax exemptions for Village Taxes. For more information, or to apply for any of these exemptions please contact the Village Hall at 518-869-7562.

Senior Citizen Exemption renewal and Disability Exemption renewal forms were mailed out in November 2020. Please fill out all required fields and turn in your 2020 tax information with your submittal. All information must be returned by close of business, to the Village Hall office no later than Tuesday, February 16, 2021. Any and all renewals received after this date will not be accepted. If you have any questions, please contact the Village Hall 518-869-7562.

Village residents who are 65 years of age by 1/1/21 and whose total annual income is less than \$37,400 for the 2020 calendar year, may be eligible for a **Senior Citizen Exemption** in the Village of Colonie. For more information, or if you would like to apply, please contact Village Hall 518-869-7562.

If you believe you are eligible for a **Disability Exemption** and your 2020 income was less than \$37,400, please contact Village Hall for more information or to apply for a Disability Exemption 518-869-7562.

If you are currently receiving a Veterans Exemption with us, there is no renewal necessary. However, if you are receiving a Disabled Veterans Exemption from us and your disability level changes, please contact us at the Village Hall and provide us with proof of that change so we can update your exemption percentage. If you do not currently have a Veteran's Exemption and would like to apply for one, please call Village Hall and we will gladly provide you with the forms. With your application, we will also need a copy of your honorable discharge papers and if disabled, a copy of your military disability papers.



# Message from the Chief's Office

**COVID 19** – Since the beginning of the COVID 19 epidemic last March, the members of the Colonie Fire Company did not stay at home when the bell rang - they responded to ALL of your calls for help and the manpower response was incredible. Considering that we were faced with a situation that most of us had never faced before, several operational adjustments needed to be made within the fire department. We persevered and continued our service without any interruption or decrease in response staffing. In addition, we managed to provide drive-by birthday parades for over 60 children. These birthday parades were an attempt to provide children some sort of special occasion on their birthday, at a time when all but essential businesses were closed and parents had limited options to celebrate their child's birthday. Doing something for the children in our community and seeing them smile always makes our members happy.

9-11 Never Forget ceremony cancelled - Unfortunately, we were forced to cancel the ceremony that we had scheduled at Forest Park School on 9-11 due to the death of a 40+ year member of our department. We apologize for any inconvenience that this cancellation caused our residents. however we tried our best to get the word of the cancellation out to the public through several media channels and postings. We did post a fire truck at Forest Park School that

evening to meet any residents who did not get the word and explain our cancellation and we appreciate the support and understanding that those residents offered to us. We hope to see you next year when we take time to recognize the 20th anniversary of that terrible loss to our state and nation.

# **Code Enforcement**

### **Basketball Apparatus**

With the winter season coming, we ask that all basketball apparatus be removed from the street and Village right of way so they aren't damaged by snow plows. There is a Village of Colonie ordinance that addresses this issue:

Local Law #4 of 2010:

Sec. 1 242 (I) (4) (e) Portable Basketball Apparatus

- 1. No portable basketball apparatus, hoop, pole, backboard or other attachment may be placed in or upon any public street or highway, or encroach upon any Village of Colonie right-of-way or public thoroughfare. In no event shall any such apparatus, hoop, pole, backboard or attachment be placed within 10 feet of any Village street line.
- 2. Any such basketball apparatus found to be in violation of this restriction may be removed by Village of Colonie personnel, upon ten (10) day written notice to the property owner.
- 3. In the event that the Village of Colonie shall determine a public hazard exists and a threat to public safety and motor vehicle traffic, the basketball apparatus may be removed immediately.



# A message about Recycling

# **Keep it GREEN, Keep it CLEAN**

The holiday season is in full swing, but remember that recycling is a year-round activity. Here are a few ideas to help remind you to reduce, reuse, and recycle, while you celebrate the holidays.

- Wrapping paper belongs in the trash. Please, do NOT recycle wrapping paper, it has plastics, foil and finishes on it that are not recyclable. If you put it in your recycling bin you could contaminate your recyclables.
- **Old Christmas tree lights?** Consider mailing them to be recycled. Check out these great programs: https://www.holidayleds.com/free-light-recycling or https://www.christmas-light-source.com/Christmas-Lights-Recycling-Program c 210.html for more information.
- The holidays are one of our biggest times for cardboard recycling. Please remember to break down all your boxes flat and recycle all the loose pieces of cardboard that come in your packages or toys.
- This is a great time of year to reuse all those old gift bags you've been saving. Gift bags are usually sturdy enough to last quite a few gift givings, but remember to take off last year's tags! Or consider giving your gifts in reusable bags or containers, the recipients will appreciate the thought and the bonus gift!
- The NYS bag ban is back in effect, remember to bring your reusable bags with you when you do your holiday shopping.

Need to clear some room before the big day?

Consider taking your old clothes, toys and electronics and donating them. Items broken or ruined? Consider how to properly dispose of those items so they do not end up in the landfill. Some organizations take ruined clothes to turn into new ones and others take old or broken electronics to be recycled and disposed of properly.

- Make sure you pay attention to your garbage and recycling day pick-ups during the holidays. Check this Villager to see if your pick-up day is affected. We also post on our website when our garbage and recycling days change.
- So, what should you do with your old Christmas tree at the end of the season? The Village has a fantastic service where if you leave it by the curb, we will pick it up and have it chipped (please remove all lights, decorations, tree stand and bags). All the chipped trees are delivered to a local recycling facility to be composted. This service is for real trees only, your artificial trees can be bagged if possible and placed in or next to your trash.
- Cleaning out your pantries before or after your holiday meals? Consider donating nonperishable food items to our Village Outreach Center, who helps local families in need throughout the entire year.

# A message from the Traffic Committee

Dear Village of Colonie Residents,

As we approach Winter, the Village of Colonie Traffic Committee would like to remind you all of some safety concerns to consider as you drive on and around Village streets. Continue to be on the lookout for children at and around bus stops as well as school areas. Anticipate children walking and running to catch their buses and remember, "Children may not always use best judgment and safety skills". School buses that are stopped with red flashing lights and a stop sign extended mean STOP! Do Not Pass or Attempt to Go Around!

The change of season will bring us ice and snow, which can cause driving conditions to change very quickly.

- 1. Please drive cautious and be prepared.
- 2. Before you drive, clear your entire vehicle from snow and ice. This will keep snow and ice from falling onto your windshield or blowing onto the vehicle behind you.
- 3. Your vehicle stops and turns differently on snow and ice, so give yourself extra time to get where you need to be. When the temperature is at or below freezing, Slow Down.

- 4. Be extra cautious around snowbanks especially around driveways, street corners and intersections where visibility is limited.
- 5. Please remember to not park on the streets during or directly after a snowstorm. This will give our plow crews a better chance to clear the streets for you.
- 6. Even though it is cold outside we still share the roads with bicyclists and pedestrians, as well as people in wheel-chairs or mobile devices. That being said, the sidewalks and roads may be hard to use or navigate and cause people to be in the driving lane, so please be extra careful.

All plow drivers as well as any other driver, please be aware that children may be playing in, on and around snowbanks!!

Plain and simple; Go Slow in the Snow!!

The winter in the northeast can be beautiful but it is not always safe to drive on, so always use caution and remember to Drive 25 on Village streets unless marked otherwise.
