Heavy Item Pick-Up Procedures for 2023

The Village of Colonie Heavy Item Program will begin on Monday, June 5th and run until Monday, August 21st. Pickups will be each Monday, excluding holidays. Each residential address will be eligible for one pick-up per year. There is a non-refundable fee of \$25. Reservations must be made in person at Village Hall, 2 Thunder Road on weekdays during normal business hours 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Residents are required to fill out a Village of Colonie Heavy Item Form and coordinate the date for their assigned pick-up. Proof of residency will need to be provided (driver's license, cable bill, utility bill or tax bill). Upon your reservation, you will receive a copy of the completed Village of Colonie Heavy Item Form, along with a list of rules of the program. You can check our website at colonievillage.org for a list of items that will and won't be accepted for Heavy Item Pick-Up. Please note that this list is subject to change without notice. If you have any further questions, please direct them to the Department of Public Works at 518-869-6372.

Leaf and Brush Recycling Will Start for the Season March 27th, Weather Permitting

- 1. Leaf/brush pickup rotates continuously around the Village from spring until fall.
- 2. Put leaves/grass clippings in brown recycling bags or labeled barrels ONLY, not to exceed 40lbs. Do not use plastic bags or boxes. NO ROCKS, GARBAGE, SOD OR PLASTIC MAY BE PLACED IN THE LEAF BAGS.
- 3. Branches must be cut in lengths of 4ft or less and securely tied with string in bundles not to exceed 40lbs. The diameter of the branches to be bundled MUST BE 3 INCHES OR LESS.

- 5. Yard waste stickers for \$3.00 each are available for purchase at Village Hall.

April Water Bills to be Mailed April 1st; Payment due May 15th.

If you would like a receipt for your water bill payment, simply return the bottom portion of your bill with "receipt requested" box checked. Please do not staple payments to remittance stubs. Unpaid water bills will be added to June, 2023 Village Tax Bills.

Reminder: The dropbox, in front of Village Hall at 2 Thunder Road, can be used to place your payments and/or correspondence. The dropbox is checked daily.




Hydrant Flushing

This annual program ensures that all fire hydrants within the Village are functioning in case of an emergency and to ensure that there is no stagnant water within our water system. The 2023 flushing of the water system will begin on March 27th weather permitting. We do not flush hydrants when the temperature is below freezing. All flushing will be done between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00 am to cause as little disruption as possible to our residents and businesses. During this time, you will see our Village trucks and employees out at night with hoses at the hydrants. If you have any questions about their work, you can contact the DPW office the following morning.

Residents may notice discoloration in their water during this program and should be aware this is normal and not harmful. This discoloration is caused by naturally occurring sediment in the pipes that is stirred up when the high volume of water

> is run through them during the flushing. Again, this sediment is not harmful. However, residents are cautioned to check and run their cold water before using their washing machine or any other appliance that uses water. If discoloration persists,

The Sand Creek Road Complete Street Feasibility Study

The Capital District Transportation Committee (CDTC) has approved the Village of Colonie's request for a Sand Creek Road Complete Street Feasibility Study awarded on March 3, 2022.

The funding, through the Unified Planning Work Program, includes a consultant's budget of \$65,000 (\$50,000 of federal funds and a \$15,000 local match) with an additional \$30,000 in CDTC staff technical assistance.

The Village of Colonie will also contribute \$10,000 of in-kind staff support to this project. The project is expected to begin in March.

Message from The Chief

The Colonie Fire Company, your Village Fire Department, had a very busy 2022. We responded to 563 fire calls for the year, up from 517 in 2021. In 2022, our members assisted Colonie EMS at dozens of the highest-priority EMS calls (ECHO responses) and we were involved in several cardiac arrest reversals. We are a group of highly-trained volunteer firefighters who are there for our residents 24/7, 365 days a year. On this past January 20th, 2023 we fought 4 working structure fires in a 27-hour time period. Just this past February 9th thru the 11th we performed three successful automobile rescue extrications of victims trapped inside their vehicles upon being involved in an auto accident. Our members know that their efforts make a difference in people's lives on a regular basis. We are in desperate need of volunteers to help staff our fire trucks and fulfill our mission to protect

this Village. We will train you and provide all of your equipment, the only cost to you is your time. You will receive a paid retirement incentive and there are several other benefits that you can qualify for as an active member of the Colonie Fire Company. 



Central Avenue Tunnels

In the late 1920's, due to increased traffic of vehicles and trolleys on Central Avenue, four tunnels were constructed under the road for pedestrian safety, specifically near schools where there was heavy foot traffic. The four tunnels were located near Roosevelt School, Maywood School, Roessleville High School and Colonie Village School at 1653 Central Avenue. The tunnels allowed pedestrians and scores of school children to cross a bustling Central Avenue without worry of being hit by motorists or trolley cars, neither of which had quick breaking systems like we do today. After being in use for nearly sixty years, the tunnel entrances were demolished and filled in.
