## **Department of Public Works**

#### Leaf Pick-Up

The Village's Department of Public Works will begin using the leaf vacuum on Wednesday, November 1st, and will continue until the weather precludes further operation.

ABSOLUTELY NO STICKS, ROCKS, OR OTHER DEBRIS WILL BE PICKED UP. There is no set schedule for operation, and there is NO guarantee that leaves will be vacuumed. Therefore, given the weather-dependent nature of the leaf vacuum machine, all residents are encouraged to bag their leaves when possible. The leaf vacuum will not be used in freezing temperatures, heavy rain, or snow. Weekly leaf bag pickup will continue until Monday, December 4th.

#### Water Bills

October water bills were mailed on October 1, 2023 and are due by November 15, 2023. Receipts will be returned, by request only. Please indicate on your remittance stub if you would like a receipt, and we will gladly provide you with a stamped receipt.

#### Tax Bills

We will accept Village Tax payments until the 31st day of October. Anything left unpaid after October 31st will be sent to Albany County for collection.

We ask that you refrain from stapling any checks to remittance stubs, as they are processed through a check reader. For your convenience, there is a drop-box located curbside at Village Hall. Please utilize this to leave payments after hours, it is checked daily. We are currently taking credit cards (in-person payments only at this time). There is a 3% processing fee for all credit card transactions. Yard waste stickers are available for purchase at Village Hall, stickers are \$3.00/each.

## **Code Enforcement**

With the winter season coming fast upon us, we want to remind all residents that all basketball hoops and poles must be removed from the Village streets and right-of-way. This is to ensure they are not damaged by snowplows. According to Village Code, basketball hoops and poles cannot encroach on any Village right-of-way or public thoroughfare or be placed within ten feet of a Village street line. Any basketball hoops and poles found to be in violation may be removed by the Village upon ten day written notice to the property owner. If it is determined that it is a public hazard or a threat to public safety or motor vehicle traffic, it will be removed by the Village immediately. 
## Message from the

## **Village Water Department**

The EPA - Environmental Protection Agency as part of the Lead and Copper Rule Revisions is requiring all water systems to prepare and maintain an inventory of water service line materials by October 16, 2024. To meet this deadline, The Village of Colonie requests your help in identifying the water service pipe material as it enters your house/building. If you have any questions or if you would prefer to have a Village Water Department representative identify your service, please call 518-869-6372 to set up an appointment. We thank you for your help.

## **STEP 1:**LOCATE YOUR PIPE

This is typically found in the basement near your water meter. Testing should be performed where the service enters the building, before the shut-off valve and the water meter. In some instances, a very short length of pipe may enter the house before transitioning to another material. Please see the diagram below.



## STEP 2:

## TEST YOUR PIPES

## What you need:

- A key or coin
- Strong fridge magnet.

#### How to test:

- 1. Test the pipe first with the magnet to see if it sticks. If not, move on to the scratch test.
- 2. Use your chosen item to gently scratch the pipe (like you would a scratch ticket) where is comes into your house.

#### **TYPES OF PIPES:**



#### **Galvanized Steel Pipe**

If a magnet sticks to the surface your service line is galvanized steel. A scratch test is not needed. If you do scratch the pipe, it will remain dull gray.



#### **Copper Pipe**

A magnet will not stick to a copper pipe. Scratch the pipe with a coin. If the scratched area is copper in color, like a new penny, your service line is copper.



#### Lead Pipe

A magnet will not stick to a lead pipe. Scratch the pipe with a coin. If the scraped area is shiny silver and flakes off, the service line is lead.



Take a picture of that area with your phone or camera. (See examples)



#### STEP 4:

#### **REPORT YOUR RESULTS**

Now that you have identified your water service line material and taken a picture, email it along with the following information to water@colonievillage.org

Slow down when driving; remind family, friends, and neighbors to be aware of the speed limits and report problem drivers to the police by using the non-emergency line 518-783-2744. Lawn signs encouraging people to "Slow Down" will be back out in the spring. If you would like your residence added to the list of addresses for sign placement, please send requests to the Village Hall; attention "Traffic committee". For any traffic concerns, issues, or updates, please feel free to attend the Traffic Committee meetings at the Village Hall on the 2nd Thursday of every month beginning at 6:30pm.

Again, please remember to "**Drive 25**" through the Village residential streets. After all, this is your community, and we all want to be safe.

## FALL RECYCLING

Recycling can happen with more than just paper and plastic! Check out some options for recycling your leaves this fall:

#### Mow over the leaves:

The easiest and most simple way to use your leaves is to mow over them with a mulching blade. This chops the leaves up into fine pieces. The leaf pieces will release nutrients as they decompose, fertilizing and protecting your lawn in the winter.

## **Mulch your leaves:**

The next option is to gather your leaves and spread them around shrubs, bushes, and trees so they can work as mulch. This helps moderates soil temperature, can prevent erosion, reduces weeds, and provide nutrients for plant roots as it decomposes over time.

#### **Compost them:**

There are hundreds of great resources online or at the library where you can get more information on composting your leaves and other waste in your own backyard!

#### **Brush Pickup:**

Let us do the work for you. Collect your leaves in barrels or paper lawn bags and leave them out for the Village to pick up. We take our brush to be composted and reused again later! Please remember absolutely NO rocks, plastic or trash or sticks can be in these bags!

# Stormwater Management

If you've been thinking about reducing your environmental footprint, you can take steps to decrease the amount of pollution that flows from your home into local waterways every time it rains, this is known as stormwater. Tips for stormwater management this fall:

- Don't rake leaves or yard clippings into the storm drain to avoid clogs and debris that could cause flooding.
- Pick up pet waste and keep trash and dirty water away from pavement and storm drains, where it can contaminate stormwater that flows downstream.
- Yard cleanup is important, once rain or snow hits the ground, it can carry dirt, chemicals, and other pollutants downstream from your home and yard to the rivers and lakes in your community.



## **New Equipment**

The Department of Public Works recently acquired two new pieces of equipment. A Trackless (pictured at right) that can be used as a mower, snowblower and a



sidewalk plow, and a two-man, right-side drive recycling truck (pictured below). These new vehicles will help our DPW in their work throughout the Village.



## **OUTREACH Center**

The Village Outreach is a resource available to all residents. The Outreach can provide information and referrals on community services, supports and government programs that will assist individuals and families in need.







## **Cook Park Sign**






# **Employee Tributes**

## Message from the Fire Chief

Parade competition - On Saturday, June 17th the Colonie Fire Company competed in the Hudson Valley Volunteer Firemen's Convention held in Glens Falls. CFC members placed 3rd in the Dress parade which required them to march during a driving rainstorm.

Pictured (right)are our members lining up in formation just minutes prior to the start of the parade. Also pictured (below) is our 2018 Pierce pumper "Engine 406" which was in the parade and received a score of 94 out of a possible 100.



Mobile home fire with trapped pets - On Thursday, July 17th at 12:58 pm our members responded to a mobile home fire where we there were several cats and guinea pigs still inside the home during the fire. Pictured are members of Colonie Fire Company removing a cage containing five guinea pigs that were still alive, out of the heavily damaged trailer. In addition to the guinea pigs, there were several cats that were also rescued by our firefighters.



Backyard safety - PLEASE do not leave children unattended, especially around swimming pools as tragedy can strike at any time. Last summer our members responded to a 2-year-old boy who drowned in a pool and then again just one year and one day later we had another child drowning call. On Friday



evening August 9th our members responded along with Colonie Police and Colonie EMS to a call at a Village residence for a 4-year-old boy who drowned in a swimming pool. The little boy was in cardiac arrest when he was removed from the pool and our members worked feverishly to resuscitate him there at the scene. Thankfully, pulses were finally restored by the time the child arrived at the hospital and he continues to fight towards recovery as of this writing. This was a difficult call, but our members are committed to saving lives and protecting property in our community and we never hesitate to answer the call. We value the commitment that our members have to each of you and your families, and we thank each of them for their contribution to our mission. PLEASE be aware of your children when they are in proximity to swimming pools.
