As warmer weather approaches, I would like to share some highlights from this past winter and information about upcoming spring events:

- A new wood chipper, sewer camera, dump truck and pick-up truck were purchased for the Department of Public Works. These items completed our 5-year replacement plan for 2023.
- In January, 2024 we purchased a specialty combo truck that will allow us to clean drainage and maintain sewer and water lines efficiently.
- In the coming months, the process of renovating the Shaker Creek Pump Station will begin.

Heavy Item Pick-Up Procedures for 2024

The Village of Colonie Heavy Item Program will begin on Monday, June 3rd and run until Monday, August 19th. Pickups will be each Monday, excluding holidays. Each residential address will be eligible for one pick-up per year. There is a non-refundable fee of \$25. Reservations must be made in person at Village Hall, 2 Thunder Road on weekdays during normal business hours 8:30 am - 4:30 pm Residents are required to fill out a Village of Colonie Heavy Item Form and coordinate the date for their assigned pick-up. Proof of residency will need to be provided (driver's license, cable bill, utility bill or tax bill). Upon your reservation, you will receive a copy of the completed Village of Colonie Heavy Item Form, along with a list of rules of the program. You can check our website at colonievillage.org for a list of items that will and won't be accepted for Heavy Item Pick-Up. Please note that this list is subject to change without notice. If you have any further questions, please direct them to the Department of Public Works at 518-869-6372.

Leaf and Brush Recycling Will Start for the Season March 25th, Weather Permitting

- 1. Leaf/brush pickup rotates continuously around the Village from spring until fall.
- 2. Put leaves/grass clippings in brown recycling bags or labeled barrels ONLY, not to exceed 40lbs. Do not use plastic bags or boxes. NO ROCKS, GARBAGE, SOD OR PLASTIC MAY BE PLACED IN THE LEAF BAGS.
- 3. Branches must be cut in lengths of 4ft or less and securely tied with string in bundles not to exceed 40lbs. The diameter of the branches to be bundled MUST BE 3 INCHES OR LESS.
- 4. If you have any questions, please call the Department of Public Works, Monday through Friday, 7:00 am until 3:30 pm at 518-869-6372
- 5. Yard waste stickers for \$3.00 each are available for purchase at Village Hall.

Message from Village Hall

April water bills will be mailed April 1st; payment due May 15th.

If you would like a receipt for your water bill payment, please return the bottom portion of your bill with the "receipt requested" box marked.

If you still have not paid your December 2023 sewer bill, there is still time! We will accept sewer payments until May 15th. Any water or sewer bills left unpaid after May 15th will be added to the June 2024 Village tax bill.

Village tax bills will be mailed out the first week in June 2024. Please contact Village Hall if you do not receive your bill by June 7th. Tax bills are due by July 1, 2024, U.S. postmark is acceptable. If you have your taxes paid through your bank by way of escrow, we will send your tax bill to your bank for payment.

Reminder: The dropbox, in front of Village Hall at 2 Thunder Road, can be used to place your payments and/or correspondence. The dropbox is checked daily.

Dear Village of Colonie Residents,

As we prepare to welcome the spring season, the Village of Colonie Traffic Committee reminds you that spring not only means warmer weather but also that people are venturing outdoors and becoming more active. We are proud to live in such a wonderful community where we can enjoy our many parks, trails, and well-kept streets for walking, bicycling and other outdoor activities.

We are asking that you help us and be responsible; slow down when driving; remind family, friends, and neighbors to obey the speed limits; and report problem drivers to the police by calling the non-emergency line 518-783-2744. If you need to report an emergency, please call 911 or 518-783-2811. Look out for children playing, people walking their pets and remember to yield to pedestrians in cross walks.

School is still in session, so please take note of school buses. A school bus that is stopped with red flashing lights and a Stop sign extended, means Stop! Do Not Pass or attempt to go around!

Lawn signs reminding people to "Slow Down" have helped to promote safety awareness in the Village. We are happy to announce that these signs will be placed on lawns again this year. There will be an opportunity for Village residents to display these signs in the future. You may send requests to Village Hall; attention "Traffic Committee." We also invite you to attend the Traffic Committee meetings on the 2nd Thursday of every month beginning at 6:30 pm in Village Hall.

Please remember to "**Drive 25**" through the Village residential streets. This is our community, and we all want to be safe. Thank you.

Stormwater

As we look forward to warmer weather and late spring lawn care, we can't forget how our landscaping practices and choices affect our community and the environment around us. Let's use stormwater smart lawncare. When water from rain, snow, or sleet flows over the ground, it's called "stormwater." Stormwater can pick up debris, litter, fertilizer, and pesticides used for lawn care. When stormwater flows into street gutters, storm drains, and drainage, it can pollute rivers, lakes, and streams. Follow these simple pollution solutions to help keep local waterways clean and healthy!



DON'T MOW TOO LOW

Only remove 1/3 of the grass blade height and leave clippings on lawn to allow nutrients to return to the soil—they act as a natural fertilizer!



CHEMICALS

Read the label when applying pesticides CAREFUL WITH and fertilizers, use them sparingly, and avoid applying them to pavement. When there is rain in the forecast, any chemicals you apply can wash downstream.



ONLY RAIN IN THE DRAIN

Don't rake, sweep, or hose debris down the storm drains. Leaves, yard clippings, and trash can clog storm pipes, causing floods and polluted waterways



CURB YOUR WATER WASTE

Direct sprinklers toward the lawn and away from pavement to save water and keep chemicals and debris out of storm drains. Check out www.epa.gov/watersense for more tins to save water!



Hydrant Flushing

This annual program ensures that all fire hydrants within the Village are functioning in case of an emergency and to ensure that there is no stagnant water within our water system. The 2024 flushing of the water system will begin on March 25th weather permitting. We do not flush hydrants when the temperature is below freezing. All flushing will be done between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00 am to cause as little disruption as possible to our residents and businesses. During this time, you will see our Village trucks and employees out at night with hoses at the hydrants. If you have any questions about their work, you can contact the DPW office the following morning.

Residents may notice discoloration in their water during this program and should be aware this is normal and not harmful. This discoloration is caused by naturally occurring sediment in the pipes that is stirred up when the high volume of water is run through them during the flushing. Again, this sediment is not harmful. However, residents are cautioned to check and run their cold water before using their washing machine or any other appliance that uses water. If discoloration persists, please notify the DPW at 518-869-6372.

The Easter Bunny is Headed Your Way!

VERY IMPORTANT: On the days of the parade, keep an eye and ear out for the music truck playing Easter tunes, grab your coats and head outside so the Easter Bunny can see you!





DPW New Equipment

The DPW acquired several new pieces of equipment to complete their 5-year plan to replace older inefficient machines. Among them is a wood chipper that can chip larger tree trunks at a faster rate, making storm damage cleanup more effective. It also has new safety features that keep our employees safe. A new sewer camera with higher image resolution allows us to inspect pipes and drains to pinpoint and address any issues immediately. Pictured above is our new water vac combination truck. This new vehicle acts as the Swiss army knife of equipment for our infrastructure maintenance. It can jet and vacuum sewer and water lines, clear storm drains and sewer lines, vacuum up messes and small flooding. It can also perform hydro excavation for more delicate projects. The water vac will help DPW employees during water breaks to work quicker and more efficiently to fix the problem and turn water back on sooner.



Message from The Chief

Happy New Year to everyone! Colonie Fire Company had a busy year in 2023 - we responded to 524 calls and there were 3,951 firefighter responses to answer those calls. 5,311 firefighter-hours were spent on those fire calls alone – but that number does not count all the dozens of public-service details that we attended over the year or all of the training that we completed. We are a busy fire department, and we are always in need of more volunteers, so if you have not considered joining the firehouse family here in the Village, there's no better time than the present to help your neighbors and the community by joining us today. Your training and equipment are provided at no cost to you and there are several benefits to being a volunteer firefighter. We have a fully equipped gym for our members, you are afforded a tax incentive and there is also a service award program where firefighters earn financial credit for each year of active service provided to the Village. Finally, and most importantly, is the feeling of accomplishment that you get when you know you have made a difference in



someone's life during their time of need.


presence of carbon monoxide (CO), an odorless gas that is life-threatening in high concentrations. CO conditions can develop at any time throughout the year, but the heating season is when they are most frequent. Our firefighters will check inside your residence with one of our multi-gas meters for the presence of CO and we will also check any of your existing CO detectors or smoke alarms in the residence to verify that they are functioning properly. While at the visit, our firefighters will also check for any other fire safety issues such as overloaded electrical outlets or blocked doorways. Before leaving, our firefighters will leave a fire-safety checklist for the household, and they will provide any necessary contact numbers for referral agencies if requested by the homeowner. If you feel

that you would be well-served by a LIFEREACH visit, contact the Village of Colonie Senior Citizen Center to inquire about scheduling a visit.



Can I Recycle This in The Village?

There is no need to sort or separate your recyclables in the Village, they can all be placed in one container.
