Mayor Leak set in motion the vision of what could be a new location for Pickleball Courts within Cook Park.

Mayor Tom Tobin continued Mayor Leak's vision and accomplished getting the courts established. Under his leadership, the courts were constructed and finished. Mayor Tobin also saw a need for replacing outdated playground equipment in the area next to the pickleball site.



### Message from Village Hall

#### Water Bills

October water bills will be mailed on October 1, 2024 and are due by November 15, 2024. Receipts will be returned, by request only. Please indicate on your remittance stub if you would like a receipt, and we will gladly provide you with a stamped receipt.

#### Tax Bills

We will accept Village Tax payments until the 31st day of October. Anything left unpaid after October 31st will be sent to Albany County for collection. We ask that you refrain from stapling any checks to remittance stubs, as they are processed through a check reader. For your convenience, there is a dropbox located curbside at Village Hall. Please utilize this to leave payments after hours; it is checked daily. We are currently taking credit cards (in-person payments only at this time). There is a 3% processing fee for all credit card transactions. Yard waste stickers are available for purchase at Village Hall; stickers are \$3.00/each.

# Important Code and Safety Reminder!

Village Code prohibits the placement or use of athletic equipment, such as portable basketball units, in or within ten (10) feet of any Village Street line.

Compliance with this law is necessary to promote safety for residents and motorists in our neighborhoods. Also, it is important that Public Safety providers and DPW have complete access to the full width of Village right of ways when needed. Notices will go out to property owners who are in violation. Village Code Enforcement Officers have the authority to enforce continuing non-compliance by citation or removal of violating


Portable basketball apparatus. §242-5.I.(4)(e)

[Added 6-17-2010 by L.L. No. 3-2010]

- [1] No portable basketball apparatus, hoop, pole, backboard or other attachment may be placed in or upon any public street or highway or encroach upon any Village of Colonie right-of-way or public thoroughfare. In no event shall any such apparatus, hoop, pole, backboard or attachment be placed within 10 feet of any Village Street line.
- [2] Any such basketball apparatus found to be in violation of this restriction may be removed by Village of Colonie personnel, upon 10 days written notice to the property owner.
- [3] In the event that the Village of Colonie shall determine a public hazard and a threat to public safety and motor vehicle traffic exists, the basketball apparatus may be removed immediately.

### **Department of Public Works**

### Leaf Pick-Up

The Village's Department of Public Works will begin using the leaf vacuum on Friday, November 1st, and will continue until the weather precludes further operation. ABSOLUTELY NO STICKS, ROCKS, OR OTHER DEBRIS WILL BE PICKED UP. There is no set schedule for operation, and there is NO guarantee that leaves will be vacuumed. Therefore, given the weather-dependent nature of the leaf vacuum machine, all residents are encouraged to bag their leaves when possible. The leaf vacuum will not be used in freezing temperatures, heavy rain, or snow. Weekly leaf bag pickup will continue until Monday, December 2nd.

### **Fall Recycling**

Recycling can be more than just paper and plastic. Check out some options for recycling your leaves this fall:

#### Mow over the leaves:

The easiest and most simple way to utilize your leaves is to mow them with a mulching blade. This chops the leaves into fine pieces that will release nutrients as they decompose, fertilizing and protecting your lawn in the winter.

### Mulch your leaves:

Gather your leaves and spread them around shrubs, bushes, and trees so they can work like mulch. This helps moderate soil temperature, can prevent erosion, reduces weeds, and provides nutrients for plant roots as it decomposes over time.

### Compost them:

There are hundreds of great resources online or at the library where you can get more information on composting your leaves and other waste in your own backyard!

### **Brush Pickup:**

Let us do the work for you. Collect your leaves in barrels or paper lawn bags and leave them out for the Village to pick up. We take the brush to be composted and reused. Please remember absolutely NO rocks, plastic/trash or sticks can be placed in leaf bags!

## Stormwater Management

We have had a very wet and rainy summer. While we cannot control Mother Nature and stop sudden heavy downpours, we can work together to ensure our storm drains and pipes are clear for water to freely flow. To minimize unnecessary drain back-ups and polluted water from reaching our waterways, here are some tips to help our stormwater management system work to the best of its ability.

- While doing yard clean-up, rake leaves, yard clippings and debris away from storm drains to avoid clogs that could cause flooding.
- Bagging your brush for Village pick-up is the best practice, so when it does rain, leaf piles won't be destroyed and end up in a drain or clog a pipe.
- Pick up pet waste and keep trash away from pavement and storm drains, where it can contaminate stormwater that flows downstream.
- Yard clean-up is important. Once rain or snow hits the ground, it can carry dirt, chemicals, and other pollutants downstream from your home and yard to the rivers and lakes in your community.

They are: Michael Cox, Brady Latham, Raymond Rabanal and Emiliano Torres. This was a challenging course of study and all our four members performed extremely well. Congratulations, guys!

Colonie Fire Company Preparing for Arrival of a New Pumper.....In January of 2022, the Village Board authorized the purchase of a new pumper truck for the fire company. This new pumper will replace our oldest pumper, Engine 405, a 1993 Pierce 1,500 gallon per minute pumper.

The new pumper will be an E-One brand cab and chassis with a 6-man cab, a 2,000 gallon per minute water pump with a 750-gallon water tank and it will carry over 4,300 feet of fire hose.

In August, New Truck Committee members, Chief Jeff Kayser and Firefighter Tom Breslin, traveled to the E-One factory in Ocala, Florida to inspect the progress of the pumper construction. The group spent two days on the factory floor inspecting the pumper while the temperatures hovered at 100 degrees. Progress on the new pumper is moving along and final completion is expected in mid-September. More to come on this new pumper in the next edition of the Villager. In October, you might see drivers training on the pumper on Village streets.


### Message from the

### **Village Water Department**

The EPA - Environmental Protection Agency as part of the Lead and Copper Rule Revisions is requiring all water systems to prepare and maintain an inventory of water service line materials by October 16, 2024. To meet this deadline, The Village of Colonie requests your help in identifying the water service pipe material as it enters your house/building. If you have any questions or if you would prefer to have a Village Water Department representative identify your service, please call 518-869-6372 to set up an appointment. We thank you for your help.

### **STEP 1:**LOCATE YOUR PIPE

This is typically found in the basement near your water meter. Testing should be performed where the service enters the building, before the shut-off valve and the water meter. In some instances, a very short length of pipe may enter the house before transitioning to another material. Please see the diagram below.



### STEP 2:

### **TEST YOUR PIPES**

### What you need:

- A key or coin
- Strong fridge magnet.

### How to test:

- 1. Test the pipe first with the magnet to see if it sticks. If not, move on to the scratch test.
- 2. Use your chosen item to gently scratch the pipe (like you would a scratch ticket) where is comes into your house.

### **TYPES OF PIPES:**



### **Galvanized Steel Pipe**

If a magnet sticks to the surface your service line is galvanized steel. A scratch test is not needed. If you do scratch the pipe, it will remain dull gray.



### **Copper Pipe**

A magnet will not stick to a copper pipe. Scratch the pipe with a coin. If the scratched area is copper in color, like a new penny, your service line is copper.



#### Lead Pipe

A magnet will not stick to a lead pipe. Scratch the pipe with a coin. If the scraped area is shiny silver and flakes off, the service line is lead.



Take a picture of that area with your phone or camera. (See examples)



### STEP 4:

### **REPORT YOUR RESULTS**

Now that you have identified your water service line material and taken a picture, email it along with the following information to water@colonievillage.org


### A Veteran Salute


Beginning with this issue of the Villager, we are highlighting a veteran Village resident who has proudly served our country in the military.
