A Message from **Village Hall**

**EXEMPTION INFORMATION:**  
If you are a Senior Citizen, a Veteran or a Person with a Disability the Village of Colonie provides property tax exemptions for Village Taxes. Senior and Disability exemptions are both income driven. If your income was less than \$37,400 for the income tax filing year 2024, and you are either over 65 years of age or disabled, you may qualify for an exemption for your Village Tax. Please contact Village Hall for more information. Renewal applications for anyone who received a senior citizen or disability exemption in 2025, were mailed out in December. We also offer a Veterans exemption. To apply, please fill out an application and submit it with supporting documentation, including your honorable discharge papers to the Village Hall. Anyone who is currently receiving a Veterans exemption is NOT required to renew, unless you are a disabled Veteran and your disability rating changed. All exemption paperwork must be returned by Grievance Day, Tuesday, February 17, 2026, by 8:00pm, to the Village Hall office. Any forms received after this date will not be accepted. For more information, or to apply for any of these exemptions please contact the Village Hall at 518-869-7562.

**2026 Rentals**

Reservations for 2026 Pavilion rentals begins at 8:00am on Friday, January 2<sup>nd</sup> for Village Residents and Businesses Only; first come, first serve basis.

- Each facility has a specific fee and a refundable \$150 clean-up security deposit
- Rentals are for 6 hours; additional hours can be purchased
- Proof of insurance and/or liquor license may be required.

Call or visit the Family Recreation Center to reserve your date. Once reserved, renters have 10 business days to complete paperwork with Brian Casey; call ahead at 518-218-7782 to set up a convenient time.

Once the permit is approved, the renter will have 10 business days to submit payment (and insurance, if required). The renter will then receive a copy of their paid permit.

**Code Enforcement**

Last year, the Village of Colonie Mayor and Board of Trustees passed Local Law #4 of 2024, that added Chapter 243: Rental Registry, to the Village of Colonie Code. This allows Village of Colonie Code Enforcement to require registration for rental properties; enforcement will begin January 1, 2026. Property owners will be required to fill out a permit application and have their rental properties inspected every 24 months, or when there is a new tenant, whichever comes first. This process will help ensure there are an adequate number of working smoke detectors, working utilities and clear means of egress in all rental properties. A Message from the **Department of Public Works**



Shoveling, snow blowing or plowing snow into the roadway is a violation of the NYS Vehicle and Traffic Law - Section 1219(a). No person shall throw or deposit upon any highway any glass bottle, glass, nails, tacks, wire, cans, snow or any other substance likely to injure any person, animal or vehicle upon such highway. In addition to a summons by the Colonie Police Department, if an accident is caused by your actions, you may be held responsible for any injuries or damage caused. The Village of Colonie takes great pride in maintaining our roadways. We ask for your cooperation in helping the DPW keep Village roadways safe for everyone.



**SNOW EMERGENCIES**  
A snow emergency in the Village goes into effect when 6 inches or more of snow accumulates or creates dangerous conditions for driving and walking. No vehicles can be parked on the street during a snow emergency to allow for timely plowing, salting and snow removal. Notice of a snow emergency will be posted in local media, posting boxes, and on our website: [www.colonievillage.org](http://www.colonievillage.org). It will remain in effect for 48 hours unless it is deemed safe to suspend it earlier. Snow emergencies are enforced beginning at 7:00 am. If your vehicle remains parked on the street during an emergency, it will be towed at your expense.
